Jo-Carroll Energy receives \$14 million USDA grant

Regionally 250 square miles affected

A \$14 million grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture will accelerate buildout of high-speed fiber internet to rural areas by Jo-Carroll Energy's broadband division. USDA Deputy Under Secretary for Rural Development Bette Brand made the announcement on October 19th while in Elizabeth stating, "In this day and age, all of America needs robust, modern infrastructure to thrive. This is a necessity and not an amenity."

Jo-Carroll Energy and Sand Prairie will use the \$14 million grant to bring access to an area covering approximetly250 square miles in portions of Jo Daviess, Stephenson, Carroll, and Whiteside counties. Mike Casper, JCE President and CEO and NWILED Board Member, when asked what the grant means to members, said, "Two simple words, the future!"

Apprenticeship Grant Announcement

Multiple Jo Daviess and Carroll companies engaging

BEST, Inc. has received a grant from the IL Dept. of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to expand apprenticeship opportunities in Northwest Illinois. Outreach will include making businesses aware of the benefits of sponsoring an apprenticeship program, the process of developing an apprenticeship program, and linkage to the US Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeships. Locally, the project looks to add 20 new registered apprentices along with 5 new programs. BEST, Inc. is a non-profit that administers federally funded programs in eight Illinois counties, including Carroll, Jo Daviess, and Whiteside. Its focus is assisting adults and youth gain meaningful employment through training, job search assistance and work experience.
